The Grammar School at Leeds was founded in 2008 following the merger of Leeds Grammar School and Leeds Girls' High School. Both schools had an enviable heritage, in the case of the former dating back to 1552, whereas Leeds Girls' High School was founded in 1876. The schools were built on the principle of providing outstanding educational opportunities to young people irrespective of background.

This inclusive approach remains at the heart of our ethos today. Pupils come from a wide range of backgrounds, and all are valued and respected. As has been the case throughout our long history, our diverse school community is united by a common thread: a genuine love of learning.





A tailored approach to education

The Grammar School at Leeds provides an all-through education for girls and boys from the age of 3 to 18, ensuring a secure environment and continuous learning experience for your child.

We follow a diamond model of education where pupils learn in co-educational classes from age 3 to 11 and again at Sixth Form. From age 11 to 16, pupils are taught in single-sex academic lessons.

Our rich, stimulating curriculum paired with our caring pastoral system helps develop excellent social skills and fosters mutual respect. Both these elements are key to forging successful learners and well-rounded citizens.

Space to inspire

The Grammar School at Leeds occupies a spacious semi-rural setting on the northern edge of Leeds.

We are easily accessible to families from across Leeds, including Garforth, Oulton, Pudsey and Guiseley, as well as Harrogate, Wetherby and Ilkley and surrounding towns and villages.

We operate several dedicated bus services, which are open to pupils in Year 3 and above.

Our 140-acre campus has outstanding facilities. This gives our students the space and opportunity to express themselves and excel in sport and the arts as well as thrive academically.

While the scale of the school is impressive, good design and effective use of the buildings and grounds ensure that it quickly becomes a familiar and friendly place.

Primary School and Senior School each have their own well-equipped specialist classrooms, libraries, laboratories, halls, music rooms and indoor sports facilities.

Primary School has its own dining area for the youngest children, while in Senior School there is a refectory and each year group has a common room. Sixth Form students have their own café, common room and study areas.

Modelled on some of the best university resource centres and libraries, the Lawson library in Senior School provides an environment and range of study facilities befitting a 21st century campus enhancing the learning experiences of our pupils.

Our state-of-the-art swimming pool, track and field facilities, all weather pitches, 3G pitch and sports dome provide unrivalled opportunities for physical education.

Sitting within our outstanding Primary School, Rose Court Nursery provides 3 and 4-year-olds with an exceptional start to their educational journey.

Our youngest children enjoy their very own friendly, safe and dedicated space. Growing independence in Senior School



Our Senior School helps your child to develop into an impressive young adult who is passionate, curious, academically accomplished and empathetic; we equip our pupils with the skills and resilience to embrace the challenges and opportunities that lie ahead.

We follow a diamond model of education whereby between years 7 and 11, girls and boys are taught separately for core academic subjects but share pastoral, co-curricular and recreational time together.

Our teaching is based broadly on the national curriculum but being free of its constraints enables us to extend enquiring minds and tailor the pupils' studies to

Aim higher in Sixth Form

With its own dedicated facilities, our Sixth Form provides a crucial stepping stone between school and all that follows.

Students are exposed to an array of career and post-18 opportunities, nationally and internationally, to inspire and motivate them.

Sixth Form students are given much greater responsibility and autonomy, with school leadership positions in house, faculty, faith and other roles.

Academic study is at the heart of our provision; we are in the top 10% of sixth forms nationally for student progression.

We also pride ourselves on equipping our students for a successful and fulfilling life. This is why our excellent academic provision is complemented by a range of enrichment activities. These include a diverse and inclusive sports programme, volunteering opportunities, lectures from inspirational speakers and practical short courses on everything from student cookery to personal finances.

Great emphasis is also placed on personal and social development to help our students embrace challenge and develop meaningful lifelong friendships.





Putting your child first



Making your child feel valued, included and secure is central to our approach, and it shapes every decision we make.

Both teaching and tutor groups are smaller than most schools but pupils benefit from being part of a larger year group, enabling them to develop different friendships and interests and take advantage of wider opportunities.

Excellent pastoral care is both part of our formal provision and is a feature of the regular day-to-day interactions between pupils and staff.

Pastoral care is led by a deputy head in each of the primary and senior schools.

It is their role to support our caring and skilled class tutors, and they are aided by a team which includes school nurses and access to qualified counsellors.

Our individual needs team is also available to provide additional support to pupils when required.



Wider opportunities

Our pupils' academic life is enriched with a wide range of activities and opportunities, within and beyond the classroom.



